



2021 Vacation Camp Parent Guide

February 22-26th & April 26-30th, 2021

Hours/cost:

Camp hours: 8:30am-4:00pm Monday-Friday (\$220/week)
Before care: 7:45-8:30am Monday-Friday (\$25/week)
After care: 4:00-5:15pm Monday-Friday (\$40/week)

Themes and Activities:

Each workshop or camp has a different theme. Our goal is to offer a wide range of activities which combine farm & nature education with traditional camp activities. Activities may include interacting with animals, spending time gardening, participating in seasonal outdoor activities, playing games, nature based arts and crafts, singing songs, exploring nature, and more!

What to Pack:

Campers should come to camp each day with:

- 2 face masks
- Refillable water bottle
- Lunch
- 2 snacks (we have a designated morning and afternoon snack time)
- Indoor shoes
- Full extra set of clothing
- Appropriate outdoor gear:
 - In winter: snow pants, warm coat, mittens, hat, waterproof snow boots
 - In spring: waterproof rain boots, warm fleece or jacket, rain jacket or poncho (hat & mittens depending on temperature)

Rate, Payment and Paperwork Info:

- Vacation Camps: \$220/week, before care \$25/week, Aftercare \$40/week. Final payment is due within 5 days registration for workshops and vacation camps. Registration is not considered complete until final payment is received.
- Online camp forms, the Camper Emergency Form and the Parent Consent & Liability Release, are required at the time of registration. Additional forms (physical summary, vaccinations records, medication administration- if applicable, or allergy action plans-if applicable) are due at least one week prior to your session. Students who do not have up to date medical information which can be vouched for by a physician, are not eligible to attend. Please contact us if religious reasons hinder your ability to provide certain information. An additional form will be needed.
- Having forms ahead of time ensures that no details are missed, that we know each of our participants, and that our attention is focused on your child's happiness and well-being from the time they arrive at the farm.

Covid-19 Precautions:

Temperature checks and health screenings are administered upon arrival each morning of camp. All campers and staff must wear masks when indoors, except during meal and snack times when social distancing will be observed. Campers wash hands at frequent intervals throughout the day, including before meals and snacks. Indoor program room surfaces are disinfected daily.

Drop-Off and Pick Up:

Drop-off time at the Learning Center (first floor program room) is 8:30-8:40am each morning, unless you are registered for Before Care, with drop off between 7:45-7:55am.

Children should be picked up between 3:50-4:00pm (unless registered for After Care, with pickup anytime before 5:15pm). If parents arrive to pick up children later than 4:05, they will be charged for after care services. Before and after care have an additional charge and must be registered for in advance.

Should our staff decide to send your child home for ill health or for behavioral issues, parents will pick up their child with no refund given. In the event that you cannot pick up your child on any given day of camp, an emergency contact will be called.

Cancellation Policy:

Once students have been fully registered no cancellations or refunds will be issued. Please be sure your child is able to attend the dates you are registering for prior to finalizing your registration process.

Behavioral Expectations:

Our experienced staff will provide clear expectations regarding behavior to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all campers. Should a camper have difficulty following certain guidelines, we follow a 3 warning system where the 3^d warning results in a phone call home. If a second call is necessary on the same day, we ask that you come and pick your child up from camp immediately. No refunds will be given. Our staff is committed to working with parents to provide campers with the support they need to meet our behavioral expectations. If there are certain strategies you know help your child, please feel free to share them with our staff so we can help ensure their success at camp!

Bullying Policy:

Stonewall Farm has a strict No Bullying policy! Students seen bullying will have only one warning to correct their behavior, which will result in a call home. If a second issue occurs, the camper will be sent home without a refund. Our bullying policy includes but is not limited to: Consistent teasing, physical violence toward another student, verbal abuse, not allowing another child to participate, etc.

Documentation:

Stonewall Farm does its best to document injuries, behavioral and bullying incidents, or other important events. Parents will be expected to sign/ acknowledge this documentation upon pick-up as necessary. Parents may request a copy of the documentation for their own records.

Photo and Video:

Stonewall Farm is granted permission to use any group or individual videos or photo images taken during a camp session for publicity or promotional purposes.

Please contact us if you would not like your child's photo to be used for promotional purposes. We will require a written statement no less than one week prior to your child's registered session.

Transportation and Pick-up:

Only the person(s) listed on my child's paperwork as parents/ guardians, emergency contacts, or additional pickup persons will be allowed to pick up my child. All person(s) completing pick up may be asked for a photo ID to ensure each child's safety and well-being.
